

What?


Social distribution of prestige/shame



What's the motive behind the research?

What theories do they rely on? (framing, claims-making...)

Data and methods

esp. re: cross-national media and culture analysis

→ be critical: what are its merits and shortcomings?

Hypotheses and findings

Do the authors find what they expected to?

What is least/most surprising about their results?

Example policy **topics** (repeated from Tutorial 1)
